NIS Renewal: Overarching Vision

<u>VISION</u>

All people living in Canada are protected against vaccinepreventable diseases through immunization programs and infrastructure that are a vital element of public health.

Foundational Principles

Public-health driven; Equity-based; Culturally-informed; Respectful of Truth and Reconciliation commitments; Evidence-informed; Collaboration and coordination; Across the lifespan; Preparedness for the future
